Conditional Sentences / If - Clauses Type I, II and III

A. <u>Conditional Sentence Type 1:</u>

 \rightarrow It is possible and also very likely that the condition will be fulfilled.

Form: *If* + <u>Simple Present</u> >>> <u>Future</u> (= will + bare infinitive)

Example: If I find her address, I'll send her an invitation. Exercise : Complete the Conditional Sentences (Type I) by putting the verbs into the correct form.

 B. <u>Conditional Sentence Type 2 :</u>

 \rightarrow It is possible but very unlikely, that the condition will be fulfilled.

Form: *if* + <u>Simple Past</u> >>> <u>Conditional</u> (= would + bare infinitive)

3. If we (have)the seven seas.

4. If they (tell)very angry.

5. We (help) you if we (know) how.

6. My brother (buy) a sports car if he (have) the money.

c. Conditional Sentence Type 3 :

 \rightarrow It is impossible that the condition will be fulfilled because it refers to the past.

Form: *if* + <u>Past Perfect</u>, <u>Conditional II</u> (= would + have + Past Participle)

Example: If I had found her address, I would have sent her an invitation.
