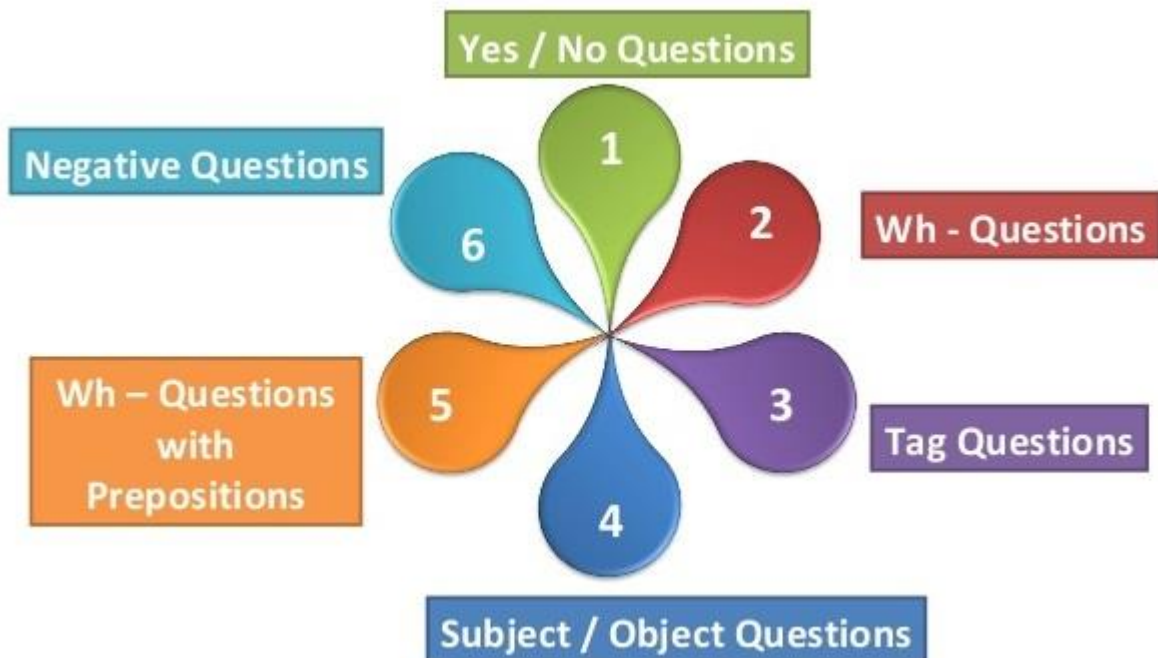


FRAMING QUESTIONS

Question forms can be classified into six categories



TYPES OF QUESTIONS

S.NO	TYPE	Purpose	Structure
1.	Yes / No Questions	a) For eliciting information	Auxiliary Verb + Subject + Main Verb
		b) Inviting	
		c) Asking Permission	Example:
		d) Offering	a) He is an engineer.
		e) Requesting	Ans: Is he an engineer?
2.	WH – Questions	a) Begins with:	Question Word + Auxiliary Verb + Subject
		Which?, What?, Who?, Where,? When?,	Example: I go to Delhi?
		Why?, How,? Whose?	Ans: Where do you go to?
3.	Tag Questions	a) Short Questions	Auxiliary Verb + not + Pronoun of the Subject + ?
		b) Asked to confirm the statement	
			Example:
			a) He is an engineer. Ans: is n't he?

Am I speaking too loud?

Were the birds making a lot of noise?

Have the clothes been ironed?

Does my name sound familiar to you?

Would you look after the baby?

Could you pass on this message to him?

Shall I carry the bags for you?

May I drink some water?

5. We shall have lunch in this hotel.

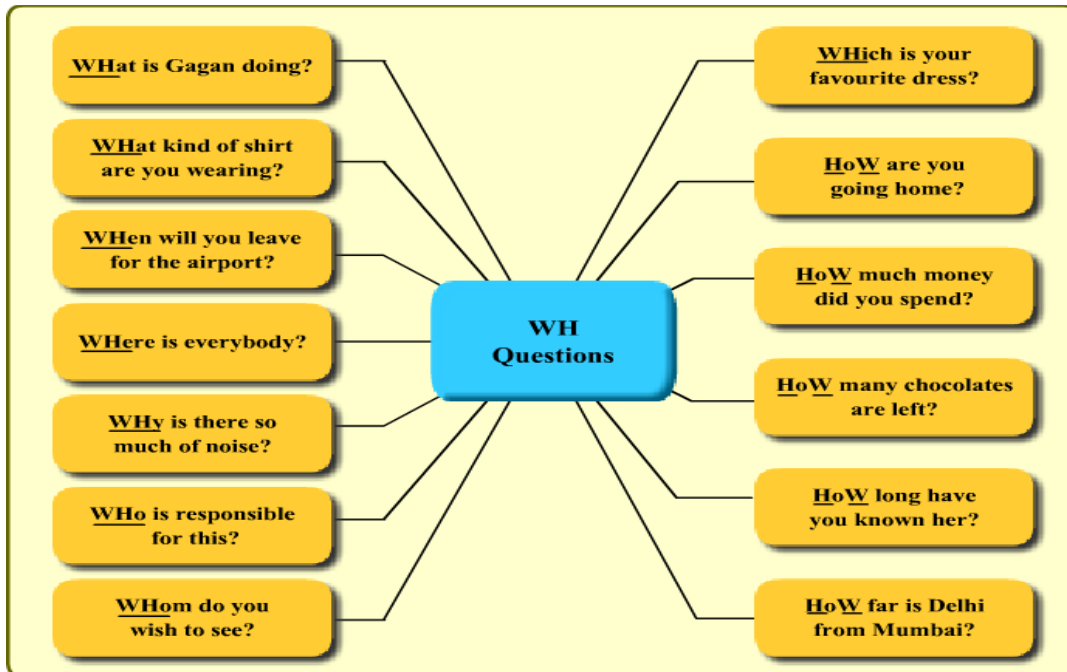
Questions

1. Would I like to attend the party?
2. Is she happy?
3. Does he play Cricket?
4. Has he resigned his job?
5. Shall we have lunch in this hotel.

Type II

Wh- Questions (Subject Questions)





Examples

-
1. I will secure first mark.
 2. He has been reading a novel.
 3. Victor read books.
 4. She saw a snake gliding by.
 5. I live in Chennai.
1. Who will secure first mark?
 2. Who has been reading a novel?
 3. Who read books?
 4. Who saw a snake gliding by?
 5. Where do you live?

Tag Questions

Examples

1. I would like to attend the party.
2. She is happy.
3. He plays Cricket.
4. He has resigned his job.
5. We shall have lunch in this hotel.
6. I will secure first mark.
7. He has been reading a novel.
8. Victor read Cricket.
9. She saw a snake gliding by.

2. She **is** happy, **isn't she?**
3. He **does play** Cricket, **doesn't he?**
4. He **has resigned** his job, **hasn't he?**
5. We **shall have** lunch in this hotel, **shalln't we?**
6. I **will secure** first mark, **won't I?**
7. He **has been** reading a novel, **hasn't he?**
8. Victor **did read** books, **didn't he?**
9. She **did see** a snake gliding by, **didn't she?**
10. I **do live** in Chennai, **don't I?**

All the three Types

1. I would like to attend the party.

Tag Questions: wouldn't I?

Wh – Question: Who would like to attend the party?

Yes / No Question: Would you like to attend the party?

2. She is happy.

Tag Question: isn't she?

Wh – Question: Who is happy?

Yes/No Question: Is she happy?

3. He plays Cricket.

Tag Question: doesn't he?

Wh – Question: Who plays Cricket?

Yes/No Question: Does he play Cricket?

4. He has resigned his job.

Tag Question : hasn't he?

Wh- Question : Who has resigned
his job?

Yes / No Question: Has he resigned
his job?

5. We shall have lunch in this hotel.

Tag Question : shan't we?

Wh- Question : What shall we
have in this hotel?

Yes / No Question: Shall we have
lunch in this hotel?

6. I will secure first mark.

Tag Question : won't I?

Wh- Question : Who will secure
first mark?

Yes / No Question: Will I secure
first mark?

7. He has been reading a novel.

Tag Question : hasn't he?

Wh- Question : Who has been reading a novel?

Yes / No Question : Has he been reading a novel?

She saw a snake gliding by.

Tag Question : didn't she?

Wh- Question : What did she see gliding by?

Yes / No Question : Did she see a snake gliding by?
